(Funding: DFW staff)</li> <li>◆ DFW will write a justification for the exclusion from the fish waste MM because the local fisherman do not clean several types of fish before eating. And those that are cleaned are not gutted at the marina. (Funding: FWS staff)</li> <li>◆ DEQ and CRM will work with DFW to modify their plans for their boating facilities in the Saipan Lagoon to ensure that the shorelines will properly stabilized and the facilities have incorporated effective runoff control strategies that include the use of pollution prevention activities.</li> <li>◆ Conduct an assessment of the needs for a pumpout station determine a threshold for maximum user per pumpout. (Funding: DFW staff)</li> <li>◆ CRM will work with other appropriate agencies (DEQ, CPA, DFW, USACOE, NPS, USCG, and Mayor's Offices) to coordinate their approach and explore funding opportunities to implement all applicable marinas and recreational boating management measures. (CRM, CPA, DFW, USACOE, NPS, USCG, and Mayor's Offices staff)</li> <li>◆ Develop guidance sheets for local-appropriate management measures (adapted from the 6217 'g' guidance document) that can be implemented to prevent polluted runoff. (Funding: CRM, DEQ, and DFW staff)</li> <li>◆ Develop and regularly maintain, a "clearinghouse" of boat cleaning and maintenance information, such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Boat cleaning and maintenance BMPs</li> <li>✓ A shopping guide for non-toxic paints, cleaners, solvents, etc.</li> <li>✓ Guidance on how to comply with local and federal laws and regulations</li> <li>✓ Referrals to other sources of reliable information</li> </ul> (Funding: CRM, DEQ) </li> <li>◆ Establish baseline water quality data at marinas: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Inventory existing monitoring data, and provide data to marinas (port captains, harbormasters, lessors, marina owners, etc.) and the public for use in performing water quality assessments and establishing baseline conditions.</li> <li>2. Identify marinas where recent monitoring data is not available, and develop a plan to assess water quality, and establish baseline data, at these marinas.</li> <li>3. Assess water quality at various marinas and boatyards and determine baselines. Permit applicants are to implement appropriate MMs.</p> <p><u>USACOE-</u> 404 section 10 regulations require that non-point sources of pollution be prevented and controlled. Permit applicants are to implement appropriate MMs.</p> <p align="center"><u>COMMENTS</u></p> <p>CRM- with the approval of the CRM board, CRM can condition all major siting projects, minor projects in an APC or any other projects that could have adverse impacts on the environment, to include MMs.</p> <p>The schedule for implementation of BMPs is as follows: Impaired watersheds will be addressed first, all other watersheds will be fully implemented by the completion date.</p> <p>Pumpout station operation and maintenance will be the responsibility of the marina operator.</p>	<p>CRM DEQ DFW CPA USACOE</p>

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
